William F. Devitt, 82, who lived at 137 Seventh Ave. W. Kalispell, died Wednesday afternoon in Whitefish.

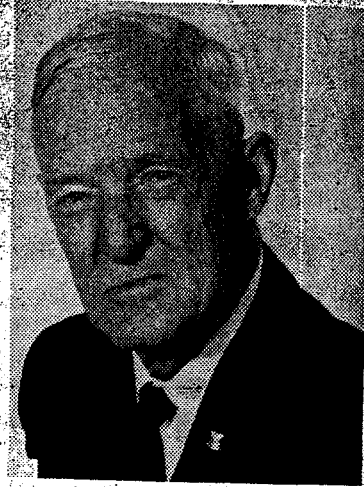
