Richard J. Zerr, 77, a former Whitefish resident, died April 22 at his home in Sun City, Calif. Private services were held with Zerr's body cremated and ashes scattered at sea.

Born June 29, 1904 near Odessa, Russia, Zerr came to Bismarck, N.D., with his family in 1913. He attended Redfield College in Redfield, S.D. He married Martha Laeger on June 22, 1926.
