FORTINE — John H. Quilling, 78, Fortine, died Wednesday in a Sidney hospital of complications following a heart attack he suffered last month. A long-time farmer and a former commercial meat cutter in the Eureka area, he was visiting his daughter in Richey at the time of his death.

He was born Dec. 9, 1905, in Iron Creek, Wis. He was educated in Lambert, where he came with his family in 1916. The family moved to Hardin in 1923.

He married Bertie Hudson Dec. 24, 1926 in Topeka, Kan. The couple moved to Menomonie, Wis., in 1931 and to Eureka in 1938. They lived in Fortine for the past 10 years. He was a member of the First Church of God in Eureka.

Allen G. Quien, 64, of Whitefish, died Friday morning in the Kalispell Regional Hospital.

He was born April 6, 1920, in Hettinger, N.D., the son of Ingeman and Ruby Quien. He moved to Whitefish at the age of 16, and served in the U.S. Army during World War II. After his honorable discharge, he returned to Whitefish, where he worked for the Great Northern and Burlington Northern Railroad for 28 years. He retired in 1977 because of ill health.

He was married to Florence Papineau on Sept. 3, 1940, in Whitefish, and is survived by her at the family home in Whitefish. He is also survived by three daughters, Sharon DeMotts and Barbara Osborne, both of Columbia Falls, and Patricia Tamblynn of San Jose, Calif., and one son, Pete (Allen) Quien of Whitefish.
