Gary Lemar Qualls, 51, Kalispell, died in Kalispell Regional Hospital Sunday evening.

He was born April 1, 1933, in Billings, a son of Garlan and Ora Qualls. The family moved to Tacoma, Wash., until 1945, when they moved to Kalispell. In 1951, he moved to Salt Lake City, Utah, where he attended Brigham Young University and worked for the Union Pacific Railroad. In 1954, he returned to Kalispell.
