Mrs. Diana N. Zwirner, 43, died May 18 in the Missoula Community Medical Center. She was born July 23, 1941, in Rawlins, Wyo., a daughter of Ernest and Eleanor Fisher. In 1945, the family moved to Lakeside, where she had received her education. She was a graduate in 1958 of Flathead High School. She was also a graduate of the Multnomah School of the Bible of Portland, Oregon, in 1961. On Aug. 24, 1962, she was married to Alfred "Fred" Zwirner in Lakeside. In 1964, they moved to Albuquerque, N.M., where Mrs. Zwirner was a school bus driver. In 1972, they moved to Portland, Ore., where she was again employed as a school bus driver. In 1979, the couple moved back to the Flathead Valley and in 1984 to Missoula, again being transferred by Mr. Zwirner's position as electronics technician with F.A.A. Mrs. Zwirner had taught piano lessons to young students throughout her married life. She was preceded in death by her father, Ernest and her grandparents, and is now survived by her husband, Fred, at the home in Missoula; a son, Steve, at home; two daughters, Tammy Zwirner, of Denver, Colo., and Terri Zwirner attending Alderson and Broaddus College in Philippi, West Virginia; her mother, Eleanor Fisher of Columbia Falls; a brother, Robert Fisher, of Reserve, N.M.; and several other relatives. Funeral services will be at 2 p.m. Thursday, May 23 in the Assembly of God Christian Center with the Rev. Robert Ross officiating. Burial will be in the Conrad Memorial Cemetery. LIBBY — Walter C. Zollars, 94, Libby, died Tuesday afternoon at St. John Lutheran Hospital of natural causes.

He was born June 20, 1890, in Oskaloosa, Iowa, to William and Lorena Zollars. He grew up on the family farm near Oskaloosa and attended local schools. He enlisted in the Navy in 1911, received an honorable discharge in 1915 and the following year moved to Libby where he was employed for a time as a woodworker and miner.

On July 23, 1917, he married Irene Rogers in Libby.

He enlisted in the Army in October 1917 and served in France during World War I. Following his honorable discharge in 1919, he returned to Libby. He was a long-time employee of J. Neils Lumber Co., later St. Regis Paper Co., retiring July 1, 1961.

Mr. Zollars served for several years as an alderman on the Libby City Council. He also was a member and past chairman of the board of trustees for Libby School District 4.

He belonged to First Presbyterian Church, American Legion and World War I Barracks.

His wife preceded him in death in 1969.

Survivors include two daughters, Faith Spencer Libby and Fern Pearson, Phoenix, Ariz.; a son, Walter C. Bud Zollars Jr., Tacoma, Wash.; a brother, William H. Zollars, Enid, Okla.; 12 grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.

Funeral services will be 2 p.m. Friday at Vial Funeral Home Chapel in Libby with the Rev. Wilford Luce officiating. Burial with military honors will follow at the City of Libby Cemetery.
