William Zweck, 76, died Monday morning at his home in Kalispell.

He was born May 22, 1910, in Cieszyn, Poland, a son of Konrad and Anna Zweck. He received his education in Poland and graduated from the University of Krakow, Poland, in 1932, with a law degree.

He then had his own law practice in Cieszyn, Poland, from 1932-1938, and served as judge there from 1938-1939.



He then entered the Polish

Army Infantry as a second lieutenant and was a prisoner of war at Murnau, Germany, until 1945.

He then served as Polish-American liaison officer and was involved in the war crimes investigation at Weisbaden, Germany, from 1945-1946 and was the displaced persons placement and work commander at Weisbaden from 1946-1947.

He immigrated to the United States in 1947, landing in New York, and later moving to Kalispell, where he worked for the Glacier Dairy until 1950. He was then employed with Conrad National Bank (presently First Interstate Bank) as an auditor, comptroller and vice

president until his retirement in 1975.

He was a member of St. Matthew's Catholic Church, Risen Christ Parish and Knights of Columbus.

In 1939, he married Emilia Zywczok in Cieszyn, Poland, and is now survived by her at the family home.

He is also survived by a daughter, Anna Boberg, of Casper, Wyo; two grandchildren, Richard and Tracy Boberg, both of Casper, Wyo; a brother, Konrad Kuchaarski of Cieszyn, Poland; and a sister, Stafania Taska of Warsaw, Poland.

He was preceded in death by a brother and a sister.
