Otha Isaacs, 92, died at his home in Kalispell on Thursday evening.

He was born Dec. 24, 1896, in Memphis, Mo., a son of Samuel and Uretta Isaacs. As a small child he moved with his family to the Flathead Valley where they farmed and ranched, freighted and worked in the timber industry.

On Dec. 14, 1917, he entered the U.S. Army at Fort George Wright, Wash., and served in France during the war. He received his honorable discharge on June 10, 1919, at Fort D.A. Russell, Wyo.

He then returned to the Flathead and worked in the family logging and sawmill business until 1938, when he began work for the Montana State Forestry Department as a log scaler. He worked his way up through district ranger at the Stillwater State Forest, state slash inspector and finally as

assistant state forester for the State of Montana.

He retired in 1968 and returned from Missoula to the family home they had retained in Kalispell. He lived there until his death.

On Sept. 12, 1921, he was married to Margaret Knowles in Kalispell and was preceded in death by her on March 21, 1986.

He is now survived by two sons, Richard Isaacs of Kalispell and Robert Isaacs of Billings; a sister, Opal Brown of Missoula; two grandchildren, Jack Isaacs and Lonnie Rae Woll, and seven great-grandchildren.

Memorial services for Mr. Isaacs will be held at 1:30 p.m. on Thursday in Johnson Mortuary Chapel with the Rev. Marvin Northcutt, pastor of Epworth United Methodist Church, officiating. Private burial of urn will be in Glacier Memorial Gardens.

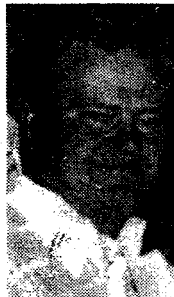
