He was born April 4, 1906, in Kalispell, to John and Victoria (Colignon) Frohlicher.

During his long life he did many things including being a cafeteria busboy at 12, a farmhand during school vacations, office worker after high school, an employee of the forest and park services, a teacher, writer, sportsman and business executive.

He authored two books about his youth in the Flathead Valley and his time as a park worker in Glacier Park. In 1981, after two and a half years of research, he wrote "Stoneage to Space Age," a history of Cascade County, Montana, for the Cascade County Historical Society.

He attended school in Kalispell, graduating from Flathead County High School in 1924. In 1933 he graduated from Intermountain College in Helena, and later attended the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis for a year's work in ecology.

In 1935 he was married to Ruth M. Gens in Great Falls and in 1942 they moved to St. Paul, where he was employed at Brown & Bigelow as a copywriter. The Frohlichers moved to Hudson, Wis., in 1944.

In Hudson he was active in com-munity affairs. He served a threeyear term as vestryman at St. Paul's Episcopal Church, was a member of the local Masonic bodies and for 10 years was worthy patron for the Order of the Eastern Star chapter.

He was an avid sportsman and a member of the St. Croix Valley Rod and Gun Club (now the Hudson Rod, Gun and Archery Club). He was appointed to a committee by Gov. Walter Kohler to study the needs of children and youth in St. Croix County. He was also active in the promotion and building of Hudson Memorial Hospital.

In 1965 he and his wife moved back to Great Falls. There he renewed his teacher's certificate and went to work for a Federal Manpower Development Training program, first teaching and then as principal. He always said this was his most satisfying job.

After his retirement from teaching in 1972, he did beaver-control work for ranchers in central Montana and ran traplines until 1985.

The Frohlichers celebrated their golden wedding anniversary Dec. 30, 1985, and midsummer of 1988 returned to Hudson to make their home at WinterGreen.

He is survived by his wife, Ruth; a son, Stephen G. of Hudson; two grandchildren, Keith of Hudson and Mrs. Mark (Mariette) Atkinson of Ypsilanti, Mich.

Preceding him in death were his parents; two brothers, John C. and Ferd; and a sister, Mrs. Robert M. (Eugene) McGregor. 🦠 🐃 🧀

There was no service or visitation in Hudson, and burial will be in Demersville Cemetery in Kalispell. The O'Connell Valley Funeral Home in Hudson was in charge of arrangements.
