





Agnes I. Everett, 95, of Kalispell, died on Saturday, March 14, 1998, at the Immanuel Lutheran Home.

She was born Aug. 12, 1902, on a farm near Creston. Her parents came to the United States from Germany in 1888, the year before Montana became a state. Three children were born in Germany. She was the youngest of nine.

She grew up in the Bad Rock Canyon area, east of Columbia Falls. As a little girl she walked 2.5 miles to school.

She and her sister, Ella, rented a room in Kalispell for \$8 a month so they could go to high school. She graduated from Flathead County High School in 1920. She taught for eight years in the rural schools, at Birch Grove, Thompson River, Marion and Egan.

She married Edwin Everett, a veteran of World War 1, on May 1, 1928. They operated a small stock ranch south of Kila. They raised Ed's nephew, Leland Alvie Everett, from the time he was a baby. Alvie died in 1976.

During world War II, she returned to teaching, working in Kila, Columbia Falls and Marion. She attended two summer sessions at Dillon Normal College and earned education credits by correspondence from the Normal College at Cheney, Wash. In all, she taught 17 years. Later she worked with the schools as a substitute teacher and a private tutor. Ed Everett died in 1952.

She described herself as an outdoor person. She moved from the ranch to three lots on 6th Street in Kalispell and raised fruit, vegetables and many flowers.

During the 1970s she moved to a smaller place on 6th Avenue West. She has traveled to California, Arizona, and to the Peace River County beyond Edmonton in Alberta, Canada. One of her favorite things was flowers.

Survivors include numerous nieces and nephews.

Funeral services will be at 1 p.m. today at the Johnson Mortuary Chapel.

Burial will follow at C.E. Conrad Memorial Cemetery.
