A brother, John Berlinsky died in 1948.

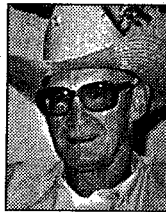

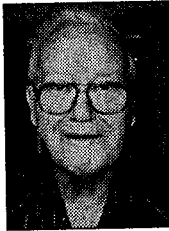
