

Ed 'Quigs' Quigley, 56

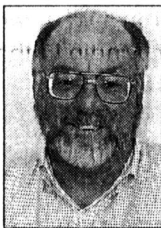
Ed "Quigs" Quigley, 56, "left the world's 'Last Best Place' for a better place" on Sunday, Jan. 19, 2003.

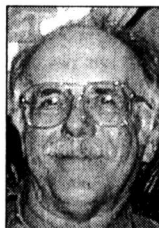
Robert L. 'Bob' Quinn, 60
