Life with Jack was kept busy with his involvement in youth sports, especially baseball, and Winter Carnival activities (he served as the first carnival's King Ullr I). Again widowed in 1981, Alda retired from the railroad in 1983 as secretary to the assistant superintendent, with over 33 years of service.

She was active in the local Methodist Church, P.E.O., and the Order of the Eastern Star,

but nothing brought more joy to her heart than, "Life itself ... faith in God ... my family and friends ... reading and flower gardening." She traveled when she could to visit family and friends, often to Sun City, Calif., where Jack's parents lived.

Alda was preceded in death by her father and mother; older sister, Eva Marie, who died as a teenager; and both of her husbands.
