Jean was truly the glue in the family and cherished by everyone. Some of the other

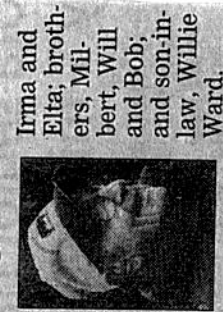

be held at a later date in Columbia Falls.

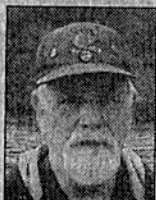
Jack E. Isaacs, 64

Robert H. "Bob" Ivey, 89, passed away June 9, 2014, at Expressions after a long struggle with Alzheimer's.

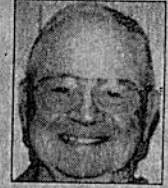
